I have noticed quite a few plants with snow scale (little white specs on the trunk of your plant) and have taken action to eliminate them. Chances are they will need watering every day and possibly even an afternoon cool down spray from the hose. You might even look for some afternoon shade. Let them have all the morning sun but protect them from that mid afternoon blaze. IT'S JUST TOO HOT!!!!!!! As we speak I will be putting up a shade cloth to offer some protection from those direct sun rays.
